PALAVA LIGHTS UP FOR THE FESTIVE SEASON



The festival of lights saw Palava decked up in all its festive glory. The city, including Xperia Mall, was brightly lit up and families got together to participate in various workshops, making Diwali even more special.

Diwali is all about brightness and the feeling called 'home'. These feelings were encompassed in the various programmes organised within the city. With the diya and lantern making workshops, citizens could prepare for the festival, while the rangoli making competition brought out their creativity and competitive spirit. Citizens also came together at Lakeshore Greens to release sky lanterns and mark the festival.

This year, Palava's lighting and decoration became the talk of the town, so much so that one of India's leading newspapers could not miss covering it in one of their editions. With a brightly lit city and families getting together to light up their homes, the festival brought out a sense of unity and celebration that resonated throughout Palava, making this Diwali truly special.











THE CITY WELCOMES A GREEN GANESHA

Palava has always been envisioned as a green and environmentally conscious city. To further the same, this year Palava introduced a green Ganesha. Replicating Mayureshwar of Morgaon, the first among the Asthavinayakas, renowned artist Haribaabu Naatesan created a Ganesh idol made entirely of alum. Placed in Xperia Mall for 5 days, the Ganesha attracted shoppers and visitors alike who were seen seeking blessings. Alum, locally known as 'fitkari', is a natural ingredient that is known for its purifying capabilities since ancient times. The Ganesha idol at Palava, on visarjan, did not pollute the water but in fact, cleaned it. Palava has always been conscious of keeping natural surroundings clean and building new means of sustainability. The Green Ganesha further established the desire of the city to be seen as an environment-friendly enclave.





NAVRATRI BECOMES A RIOT OF COLOURS.

This year, Durga Puja at Palava became the perfect time to celebrate with friends and family. The pandal, set up in Casa Rio, saw hundreds of visitors seeking divine blessings while being amazed by the sensational décor.

Citizens also danced their stress away by actively participating every night in the Garba event. Dressed up in bright, traditional clothes and decked to their finest, each night became a celebration of tradition, colours and happiness.









Extending Lodha Group's commitment towards 'Building a Better Life', the Palava team installed an innovative hoarding featuring a funnel tank with a capacity of 3,000 litres, to propagate the idea of rainwater harvesting that can help combat the grave water shortage issues of Mumbai city.

Set up outside Ghansoli Railway Station, the hoarding collected and filtered over 9,000 litres of water in a month, which supported the nearby shops and people passing by the same route. Wherein the rest of the water was transported to water shortage hit areas of Navi Mumbai like the slums of Nerul Darave, where the Palava team ended up supporting more than 50-60 families who used the water mainly for washing and cleaning purposes.

Speaking on this initiative, Viral Oza, Chief Marketing Officer, Lodha Group commented, "At Palava, we work with a focused approach to ensure the well-being of society and keep experimenting to contribute in solving community issues effectively. We have introduced sustainable and creative solutions like rainwater harvesting, sewage treatment plants, stormwater drainage system and solar plants within Palava to boost the quality of life for all and this initiative has become our first step in serving society at larae."

The focus of this initiative was to deploy a sustainable solution and portray the power of a simple idea that can aid thousands in need. Surviving on water tanks while every year gallons of rainwater get wasted in this monsoon disposed city, this effort helped the slum dwellers survive longer on their corporation water supply.





NEW EFFORTS IN SUSTAINABILITY



As a part of Lodha Group's commitment towards sustainable development, Palava is all set to begin operations of its 1.4 MW solar farm set up by Amplus Solar. Spread over 6.7 acres, the solar farm is part of Palava's sustainability focus where the city has undertaken a host of green initiatives namely 100 percent recycle and reuse of wastewater, end-to-end solid waste management, planting over 25,000 trees to improve air quality and green cover, shared transportation with bicycle sharing services like PEDL, among other measures to reduce CO_2 emissions.

The plant set up in Ghesar village features over 4,300 solar modules, which will generate about 2 million units of electricity per year, thus reducing nearly 2 million kgs of CO₂ annually. Over a period of 25 years, the solar farm will help in overall reduction in CO₂ emissions amounting to 39.14 million kgs, as per the designed life of the plant.

With existing solar installations in streetlights systems and on the rooftop of Lodha World School, the upcoming solar farm will further help in ensuring uninterrupted and stable power supply in the city by generating almost 10% of electricity supply through solar power for Palava's public spaces in the near future.



To make travelling to and from the city a more comfortable and hassle-free task, Palava recently introduced new bus routes. Featuring new air-conditioned buses with Wifi, the daily newspaper and much more, these buses transport Palavians from the city to major hubs like Ghansoli and Dombivli at an extremely nominal price. Furthermore, with 16 trains now operational from the nearby Nilje station, travelling to and from the city has become much easier.
